BURSARIES FOR STUDENTS

With the support of the **ARC/NHMRC Research Network in Ageing Well**, ERA can offer financial support through bursaries.

Criteria:

- An abstract to present a paper or poster at the ERA Conference is accepted.
- The student is an Australian citizen and is studying at an Australian University.
- The research being undertaken has a focus on aging and is expected to benefit the field of aging.
- Successful applicants of a bursary will sign an agreement stipulating that should they not be able to attend the conference, a full refund of the bursary will be repaid within 14 days.
- Bursaries are available to individuals who are not in receipt of any other financial assistance or as a top-up for those already receiving some financial assistance to attend the ERA conference.

Process:

- Application for a bursary should be made by e-mail to mpreece@brightwatergroup.com addressing all the criteria listed above.
- An application should also include full details of any other financial assistance that has been awarded to the individual to attend the ERA conference or a statement that you are not in receipt of any other financial assistance.
- Amounts of \$500 (no other assistance) or \$250 (receiving some assistance) will be awarded.

We will be offering a prize and award to students in recognition of their work in the following categories:

- Best paper presentation by a Doctoral student.
- Best paper presentation by a Masters student.
